| 1 | ANSI.SYS | Defines functions that change display graphics, control cursor movement, and reassign keys. |
| 2 | APPEND | Causes MS-DOS to look in other directories when editing a file or running a command. |
| 3 | ARP | Displays, adds, and removes arp information from network devices. |
| 4 | ASSIGN | Assign a drive letter to an alternate letter. |
| 5 | ASSOC | View the file associations. |
| 6 | AT | Schedule a time to execute commands or programs. |
| 7 | ATMADM | Lists connections and addresses seen by Windows ATM call manager. |
| 8 | ATTRIB | Display and change file attributes. |
| 9 | BATCH | Recovery console command that executes several commands in a file. |
| 10 | BCDEDIT | Modify the boot configuration data store. |
| 11 | BOOTCFG | Recovery console command that allows a user to view, modify, and rebuild the boot.ini file. |
| 12 | BREAK | Enable and disable <u>Ctrl+C</u> feature. |
| 13 | CACLS | View and modify file ACL's. |
| 14 | CALL | Calls a batch file from another batch file. |
| 15 | CD | Changes directories. |
| 16 | CHCP | Supplement the international keyboard and character set information. |
| 17 | CHDIR | Changes directories. |
| 18 | CHKDSK | Check the hard drive running FAT for errors. |
| 19 | CHKNTFS | Check the hard drive running NTFS for errors. |
| 20 | CHOICE | Specify a listing of multiple options within a batch file. |
| 21 | CLIP | Redirect command line output to the Windows clipboard. |
| 22 | CLS | Clears the screen. |
| 23 | CMD | Opens the command interpreter. |
| 24 | COLOR | Change the foreground and background color of the MS-DOS window. |
| 25 | COMMAND | Opens the command interpreter. |
| 26 | COMP | Compares files. |
| 27 | COMPACT | Compresses and uncompress files. |
| 28 | CONTROL | Open Control Panel icons from the MS-DOS prompt. |
| 29 | CONVERT | Convert FAT to NTFS. |
| 30 | COPY | Copy one or more files to an alternate location. |
| 31 | CTTY | Change the computer's input/output devices. |
| 32 | DATE | View or change the systems date. |
| 33 | DEBUG | Debug utility to create assembly language programs to modify hardware settings. |
| 34 | DEFRAG | Re-arrange the hard drive to help with loading programs. |
| 35 | DEL | Deletes one or more files. |
| 36 | DELETE | Recovery console command that deletes a file. |
| 37 | DELTREE | Deletes one or more files or directories. |
| 38 | DIR | List the contents of one or more directory. |
| 39 | DISABLE | Recovery console command that disables Windows system services or drivers. |
| 40 | DISKCOMP | Compare a disk with another disk. |
| 41 | DISKCOPY | Copy the contents of one disk and place them on another disk. |
| 42 | DOSKEY | Command to view and execute commands that were ran in the past. |
| 43 | DOSSHLL | A GUI to help with early MS-DOS users. |
| 44 | DRIVERQUERY | Display a list of installed device drivers. |
| 45 | DRIVPARM | Enables overwrite of original device drivers. |
| 46 | ECHO | Displays messages and enables and disables echo. |
| 47 | EDIT | View and edit files. |
| 48 | EDLIN | View and edit files. |
| 49 | EMM386 | Load extended memory manager. |
| 50 | ENABLE | Recovery console command to enable a disable service or driver. |
| 51 | ENDLOCAL | Stops the localization of the environment changes enabled by the SETLOCAL |

| 64 | FORMAT | Command to erase and prepare a disk drive. |
| 65 | FTP | Command to connect and operate on an FTP server. |
| 66 | FTYPE | Displays or modifies file types used in file extension associations. |
| 67 | GOTO | Moves a batch file to a specific label or location. |
| 68 | GRAFTABL | Show extended characters in graphics mode. |
| 69 | HELP | Display a listing of commands and brief explanation. |
| 70 | IF | Allows for batch files to perform conditional processing. |
| 71 | IFSHLP.SYS | 32-bit file manager. |
| 72 | IPCONFIG | Network command to view network adapter settings and assigned values. |
| 73 | KEYB | Change layout of keyboard. |
| 74 | LABEL | Change the label of a disk drive. |
| 75 | LH | Load a device driver in to high memory. |
| 76 | LISTSVC | Recovery console command that displays the services and drivers. |
| 77 | LOADFIX | Load a program above the first 64 k. |
| 78 | LOADHIGH | Load a device driver in to high memory. |
| 79 | LOCK | Lock the hard drive. |
| 80 | LOGOFF | Logoff the currently profile using the computer. |
| 81 | LOGON | Recovery console command to list installations and enable administrator login. |
| 82 | MAP | Displays the device name of a drive. |
| 83 | MD | Command to create a new directory. |
| 84 | MEM | Display memory on system. |
| 85 | MKDIR | Command to create a new directory. |
| 86 | MKLINK | Creates a symbolic link. |
| 87 | MODE | Modify the port or display settings. |
| 88 | MORE | Display one page at a time. |
| 89 | MOVE | Move one or more files from one directory to another directory. |
| 90 | MSAV | Early Microsoft virus scanner. |
| 91 | MSD | Diagnostics utility. |
| 92 | MSCDEX | Utility used to load and access the CD-ROM. |
| 93 | NBTSTAT | Displays protocol statistics and current TCP/IP connections using NBT. |
| 94 | NET | Update, fix, or view the network or network settings. |
| 95 | NETSH | Configure dynamic and static network information from MS-DOS. |
| 96 | NETSTAT | Display the TCP/IP network protocol statistics and information. |
| 97 | NLSFUNC | Load country specific information. |
| 98 | NSLOOKUP | Look up an IP address of a domain or host on a network. |
| 99 | PATH | View and modify the computer's path location. |
| 100 | PATHPING | View and locate locations of network latency. |
| 101 | PAUSE | Command used in batch files to stop the processing of a command. |
| 102 | PING | Test and send information to another network computer or network device. |
| 103 | POPD | Changes to the directory or network path stored by the PUSHHD command. |
| 104 | POWER | Conserve power with computer portables. |
| 105 | PRINT | Prints data to a printer port. |
| 106 | PROMPT | View and change the MS-DOS prompt. |
| 107 | PUSHD | Stores a directory or network path in memory so it can be returned to at any time. |

| 109 | RD | Removes an empty directory. |
| 110 | REN | Renames a file or directory. |
| 111 | RENAME | Renames a file or directory. |
| 112 | RMDIR | Removes an empty directory. |
| 113 | ROBOCOPY | A robust file copy command for the Windows command line. |
| 114 | ROUTE | View and configure Windows network route tables. |
| 115 | RUNAS | Enables a user to run a program as a different user. |
| 116 | SC | Communicate with the Service Control Manager and services. |
| 117 | SCANDISK | Run the ScanDisk utility. |
| 118 | SCANREG | Scan registry and recover registry from errors. |
| 119 | SET | Change one variable or string to another. |
| 120 | SETLOCAL | Enables local environments to be changed without affecting anything else. |
| 121 | SETVER | Change MS-DOS version to trick older MS-DOS programs. |
| 122 | SHARE | Installs support for file sharing and locking capabilities. |
| 123 | SHIFT | Changes the position of replaceable parameters in a batch program. |
| 124 | SHUTDOWN | Shutdown the computer from the MS-DOS prompt. |
| 125 | SMARTDRV | Create a disk cache in conventional memory or extended memory. |
| 126 | SORT | Sorts the input and displays the output to the screen. |
| 127 | START | Start a separate window in Windows from the MS-DOS prompt. |
| 128 | SUBST | Substitute a directory on your computer for another drive letter. |
| 129 | SWITCHES | Remove add functions from MS-DOS. |
| 130 | SYS | Transfer system files to disk drive. |
| 131 | TELNET | Telnet to another computer or device from the prompt. |
| 132 | TIME | View or modify the system time. |
| 133 | TITLE | Change the title of their MS-DOS window. |
| 134 | TRACERT | Visually view a network packets route across a network. |
| 135 | TREE | View a visual tree of the hard drive. |
| 136 | TYPE | Display the contents of a file. |
| 137 | UNDELETE | Undelete a file that was deleted. |
| 138 | UNFORMAT | Unformat a hard drive. |
| 139 | UNLOCK | Unlock a disk drive. |
| 140 | VER | Display the information about MS-DOS version. |
| 141 | VERIFY | Enables or disables the feature to determine if files were written properly. |
| 142 | VOL | Displays the volume information about the designated drive. |
| 143 | WINVER | Display the information about Windows version. |
